

## BAULKHAM HILLS SHIRE NETBALL ASSOCIATION LTD (Trading as Baulkham Hills Netball) SAFETY PROCEDURES

## The safety of all who visit Baulkham Hills Netball Complex is of paramount importance.

The Association Executive urges you to cooperate and assist them in providing a safe netball environment at the Baulkham Hills Netball complex.

## INJURY

If an injury has been sustained, it must be reported in the following manner:

- 1 The injury must be reported immediately to the Physiotherapist on duty. Non notification could result in an insurance claim being disallowed.
- 2. The Injury Book must be filled in, dated and signed by both witness and either Association Executive or Physiotherapist. Injury Books will be in the Physiotherapy Room. Non notification could result in an insurance claim being disallowed.
- 3. Anyone can report an injury that has occurred at our complex, but it must be remembered that reporting to a Club official is not enough. The Association must be notified.
- 4. If the injury is serious an Ambulance will be called by the Association Executive. Do not allow anyone else to call for an ambulance or other authority. The Executive can give important information to the controllers, and can organise to have people ready to direct the ambulance to the injured person. We can also ensure that we protect other members should an ambulance or other authority need access to the court area.
- 5. In an emergency situation do not leave the injured person but ask an adult to report to the Administration Room and request assistance.
- 6. The Association has a defibrillator available in the physiotherapy room.

## HAZARDS

Anyone can report a potential hazard to the Association Executive. We want to ensure the safety of all visitors to our complex. As players or parents of players, you have a responsibility to report any problem to the Executive so that it can be dealt with as soon as possible.

Please report the nature of the potential hazard to the Administration Room.

In an emergency situation – do not leave a hazard – ask an adult to report it ASAP.

Play your part in being responsible for the safety and well-being of all of those who come to our complex.

Be diligent and take note of any potential hazard or danger in the complex and don't ignore it or leave it to someone else.

Gardens and fenced off areas are not safe places to allow children to play.
